Results of Recent Archaeological Research at Upper Matecumbe Key—Evaluating Early Island Life

New excavations at a prehistoric living site on Upper Matecumbe Key provide rich archaeological data on what life was like for the earliest inhabitants of the Florida Keys. Unique challenges of life on the island chain were addressed in novel ways by this culture of coastal fisherfolk. We will discuss the similarities and differences between so-called Matecumbe inhabitants of the Keys, the better known Calusa of the west coast, and the contemporary people of the Everglades. Archaeological evidence is disappearing at a dangerous rate in the Keys due to development and climate change, but analysis of existing artifact collections as well as new excavation of preserved sites can provide extraordinary information about the earliest coastal inhabitants and their unique way of life.

The end of the year is approaching which means it is time for 2016 dues. We have had some financial shortfalls the past few years and have only gotten by with donations generously given by some members. For this reason, there will be a small increase in dues starting January 2016.

- Student increased to \$12 from \$10
- Individual increased to \$25 from \$20
- Family increased to \$30 from \$25
- Life memberships are no longer offered, but all current Life members will remain as Life members.

No one likes an increase in dues, but we, the Board of Directors, hope the information below on CGCAS financials will show why this increase is necessary. The following is an outline of our 2015 financials.

* Note on AWIARE donation: We previously used Barney's Storage facility to store our field gear, files and documents for an annual cost

of \$578. In the AWIARE Research Station we not only have a place for storage, we also have a room to do lab work. For use of the AWIARE Research Station, we donate \$500, which is less than we paid Barney's.

** Note on topsoil at Andersons: Between 1995 and 1997, CGCAS excavated two 2-x-2-m pits on Eric and Doris Anderson's property. One of the pits was backfilled and the second remained open for Eric to use in his site tours. Over the years, the walls began to cave in. CGCAS purchased topsoil to fill the pit and members volunteered to do the work. The price of the topsoil was \$282. Two members donated \$100 each (included in the \$450 donations) towards the topsoil.

Please note that without the \$450 donations, we would have had a large deficit. Based on 2015 membership numbers, the increase in dues will only bring in an additional \$231.

The increased dues are effective 01/01/16, but if your dues are received before 12/31/15, you can pay at the old dues rate. However, that being said, CGCAS needs extra income to operate, so we welcome any donations. The lecture series is a large part of our expenses and we want to continue to provide them for you.






